2014 WALT Pinot Noir “Clos Pepe” (Sta. Rita Hills), \$75. Rich, smoky, well-structured, incredibly long, black cherry and toasty oak flavors. **BEST OF SHOW**

2014 WALT Pinot Noir “Gap’s Crown” (Sonoma County), \$75. Big, rich, almost prepossessing, black fruit and toasty oak flavors.

2014 Cakebread Cellars Pinot Noir Two Creeks Vineyards (Anderson Valley), \$42. Finely wrought, well-knit, somewhat smoky, raspberry and toasty oak flavors.

2013 Merry Edwards Winery Pinot Noir Klopp Ranch (Russian River Valley), \$63. Taut, firm, elegantly turned, black fruit and toasty oak flavors.

2013 Merry Edwards Winery Pinot Noir Meredith Estate (Russian River Valley), \$60. Plump, silky, elegantly wrought, black fruit and cocoa flavors.

2012 WALT Pinot Noir “Sierra Mar” (Santa Lucia Highlands), \$75. Round, succulent, well-knit, black cherry and nutty oak flavors.

2013 Williams Selyem Pinot Noir Ferrington Vineyard (Anderson Valley), \$95. Lush, silky, well-integrated, black fruit and smoky oak flavors.

2013 Williams Selyem Pinot Noir Hirsch Vineyard (Sonoma Coast), \$95. Plump, stylish, well-knit, black cherry and nutty oak flavors.
